## Rachel's **STORY**





Our House is Home to 18 families each night. Some families stay for just a few days while others spend several months in our House. Rachel and her family have stayed on and off with us for the past six months. Traveling all the way from Ceres, Rachel arrived at our House when her newborn son Daniel was just 4 days old. Rachel found out she was pregnant with her second son last November and had a wonderful, full term pregnancy. Her oldest son, Kyle, was seven when is little brother Daniel was born on May 19, 2015.

Rachel and her fiancé knew something wasn't right when her son was having difficulty breathing. They took him to the hospital where he was quickly airlifted to Valley Children's Hospital. Scared and confused, Rachel went home and packed a few things then made her way to Madera. She did not know what to expect.

Daniel was diagnosed with Hypoplastic Left Heart Syndrome. HLHS is one of the most complex cardiac defects seen in newborns and remains one of the most challenging to manage of all congenital heart defects. The left side of Daniel's heart was severely underdeveloped and he would have to undergo a series of surgeries to correct it.

Rachel was exhausted, nervous, and afraid. She had not slept in nearly three days before she learned about Ronald McDonald House. When she first arrived she was greeted by staff and some of the other mothers staying at our House. "I was delirious. I checked in, went to my room and had the best night's sleep." This was the first good night's sleep Rachel had in days. Our House allows for families to step away from the beeping machines, and have a comfortable, uninterrupted night's rest. Without our House, Rachel would have traveled back home only to visit her son on occasion.





Daniel underwent his first surgery 14 days after his arrival to Valley Children's Hospital. He had suffered a tremendous loss of oxygen and his body needed to recover before he could undergo heart surgery.

"The hardest thing was saying goodbye to him when he went into surgery," Rachel said. Rachel made several friends while staying at our House and they helped one another through the process. "The people I met at the House are what helped me get through the days. They got me to laugh when I didn't think it was possible. I couldn't have gotten through this experience without them."

Rachel and her family stayed in our House for two months while Daniel got strong enough to go home. Our House allowed her to stay close to her son when he needed her most. To her, Ronald McDonald House meant a warm bed to sleep in, home cooked meals, and an abundance of support and friendship.

"Ronald McDonald House is a tremendous support to my family. I don't know what we would have done without it. Because of Ronald McDonald House, I was able to see my son every day," said Rachel. Daniel was able to go home with his family for a couple of months before his next surgery. He left with a GI Tube and a heart catheter before returning to our House again in November. Daniel underwent the second of the three surgeries required on November 17, 2015.

He is now one step closer to a healthy heart and life. Daniel's heart will require one more surgery and he will need to be monitored his entire life. It is possible he may still need one more heart surgery and/or a pace maker later in life. However, Daniel will grow up to be a happy, healthy child. Ronald McDonald House kept this beautiful family together during their time of need. We are so thankful we were able to help ease the worry of a place to stay while Rachel and her family had bigger problems to face.
