


OUR MISSION

The Central Valley's Ronald McDonald House opened in Fresno in 1984 to provide a "Home away from Home" and resources to parents and families who had a child staying at a nearby medical facility. In 2001, we expanded to an 18-bedroom House adjacent to Valley Children's Hospital.



our Programs





RONALD MCDONALD HOUSE

The Ronald McDonald House is the core program of the Ronald McDonald House Charities of the Central Valley. Our House is located in Madera, California and has 18 rooms to serve families in need. Additionally, our Day Room and Spare Room provide short-term lodging for families.

MEALS FROM THE HEART

The Meals from the Heart program unites volunteers from across the Central Valley to prepare and serve meals for families staying at the RMHCCV. Volunteer groups are serving meals at our House nearly every evening. This program provides much needed relief for families in need.

HAPPY WHEELS

The Happy Wheels Hospitality Cart was established in 2016 to bring comfort and care to children and families receiving treatment at Valley Children's Hospital. The Happy Wheels Cart serves various snacks, beverages, hygiene items, toys and activities for parents and children.

HOTELS FROM THE HEART

Our Ronald McDonald House has only 18 bedrooms and our house is at 100 percent capacity every night, often forcing us to turn away more families than we are able to serve. In an effort to minimize the number of families we turn away, we created the Hotels from the Heart program in 2016 – which utilizes a partnership with a local hotel chain to provide families with overnight accommodations. RONALD MCDONALD HOUSE CHARITIES OF THE CENTRAL VALLEY PROGRAM

The Ronald McDonald House is the core program of our organization. Our House has 18 guest rooms furnished with 2 queen beds, satellite TV, and private bathroom.

Guests share kitchens, laundry rooms, a living room, and playroom. In 2018 we were able to serve 517 families with a "Home Away from Home" while their child was treated in a local hospital. We realized not all families need or want overnight accommodations, but need a place to get away from the hospital environment, so we created the Day Room.

DAY ROOM

The Day Room is a separate suite at our Ronald McDonald House facility and includes a living room, kitchen, laundry room, full restroom, and a bedroom. Families who utilize the Day Room typically do not need over-night accommodations, but need a place to get away from the stresses of being in the hospital environment. A guest can come for a few hours and watch TV, take a nap, or prepare a meal. Since tragedy can strike at any time, some guests arrive to the hospital with their sick or injured child packing only the clothes on their back. Having a laundry room and shower available is crucial. In 2017, 841 families utilized at least one service provided by the Day Room.

SPARE ROOM

The Spare Room is the bedroom from the Day Room utilized from 8pm to 8am. Many families who utilize this room typically have an early morning appointment at the Hospital. This allows them to come from out of town a day early and stay overnight in the Spare Room and head over to the hospital first thing in the morning. Other guests utilize the Spare Room until one of the more permanent 18 rooms of the Ronald McDonald House becomes available. We were able to accommodate an additional 210 families in this room in 2017.



ADOPT-A-ROOM

The 18 rooms in our House are supported by the Adopta-Room program. The program allows individuals or businesses to be an "exclusive" sponsor of a room or common living area. Funding supports all of the families who use that room throughout the year and also aids in major room remodeling projects. The **Adopt-a-Room** program expands to the common living areas of our House. Our kitchens, laundry rooms, living room and playroom are adopted by community leaders as well.

MEALS FROM THE HEART

Through our Meals from the Heart program, volunteer groups and local businesses gather at our House almost every night to provide a meal for our families. When a family has a sick or injured child in the hospital, the last thing on their mind is what they're going to eat.

When a family knows a meal is going to be provided for them at the Ronald McDonald House, it is a huge stress reliever. For a majority of our families, it is also a huge financial relief. Whether you prepare a full spaghetti dinner or bring pizza from a local restaurant, it is a huge benefit to the families we serve. If you don't have the time to provide a meal in person, you can always donate money for us to purchase meals on nights no meals are provided by a volunteer group. In 2017, we launched our first social media crowdfunding campaign to support this program. This Dollars-for-Dinner campaign raised over \$12,000 in just four weeks!







THE HEART

The 18 rooms at the House are at 100% capacity every night, often forcing us to turn away families who need our services. In an effort to minimize the number of families we turn away, we created the Hotels from the Heart program in 2016.

Our partner hotel is TownePlace Suites by Marriott. When they heard about our dilemma, they knew they wanted to help. They offer us an extremely discounted rate to host additional families in their hotel.

Without this program, many families would have been forced to sleep in their cars or in cramped hospital rooms. Others may have had to stay home completely, missing valuable time with their sick or injured child. Your donations to the Hotels from the Heart program allow us to make an impact on families like the Flores Family.

In 2017, we served 119 families through the Hotels from the Heart program!

Flores Family story

Melissa Flores knows how difficult it is to have a child with cancer.

The Ronald McDonald House welcomed Melissa and Lonnie, providing some relief when it became possible to stay closer to Alyssa. Though the Ronald McDonald House was at full capacity during Alyssa's treatment, the House coordinated for Melissa and Lonnie to participate in the newly formed Hotels from the Heart program and stay at the nearby Towneplace Suites by Marriott.

"The program allowed us to stay closer to our daughter, even when there was no room at the House," said Melissa. "The great people at the House were so considerate of our situation —they provided a listening ear, comfort and kindness during a very difficult time in our lives." Even while staying at the hotel, Melissa and Lonnie were encouraged to visit the House to use the kitchens, eat home-cooked meals, and freshen up in the Day Room. "It was such a blessing to be able to stay close to Alyssa. The Ronald McDonald House made our difficult situation a little easier."

Alyssa is now in remission, and Melissa and Lonnie are forever thankful for the relief Ronald McDonald House provided to their family during their time of need.




