## A Message From Our EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Dear Friends,

In 2018, our organization celebrated 34 years of service in the Central Valley! Since we opened our doors in 1984, we have served thousands of families within our nine-county territory, ranging from the Valley to the Central Coast. Yet, we strive to do more. We are constantly looking for new and innovative ways to serve families in need. In recent years,



we launched the Hotels From the Heart program to increase our capacity to serve those families in need — whether they used our resources for overnight stays or they utilized the Day Room. In 2018, we converted two of our rooms to Short-Term Stay quarters. This small adjustment enabled the Ronald McDonald House to serve an additional 235 families last year.

The Happy Wheels Hospitality Cart continued to aid the Valley Children's Hospital community. We rolled the cart down the Hospital's halls four days a week and provided snacks, water bottles, hygiene items, and toys to those who needed them. We were able to bring a little relief and joy to many individuals, and we believe that had a tremendously positive impact on our campus community.

Lastly, many of you donated to our Dollars for Dinner campaign last year, in addition to being volunteer supporters and meal providers for our Meals From the Heart program. I'm pleased to report that because of your support, very few dinner hours went by without generous volunteer groups who cooked and served hearty evening meals for our families to enjoy. On those few evenings we didn't have a volunteer group scheduled, we filled those gaps with meals provided by Valley Children's Hospital Food Services or a local area restaurant.

As you can see, 2018 was a year in which we were able to increase our capacity and offer support for hundreds of families in many, many ways. We thank you for your continued support as we move in to 2019.

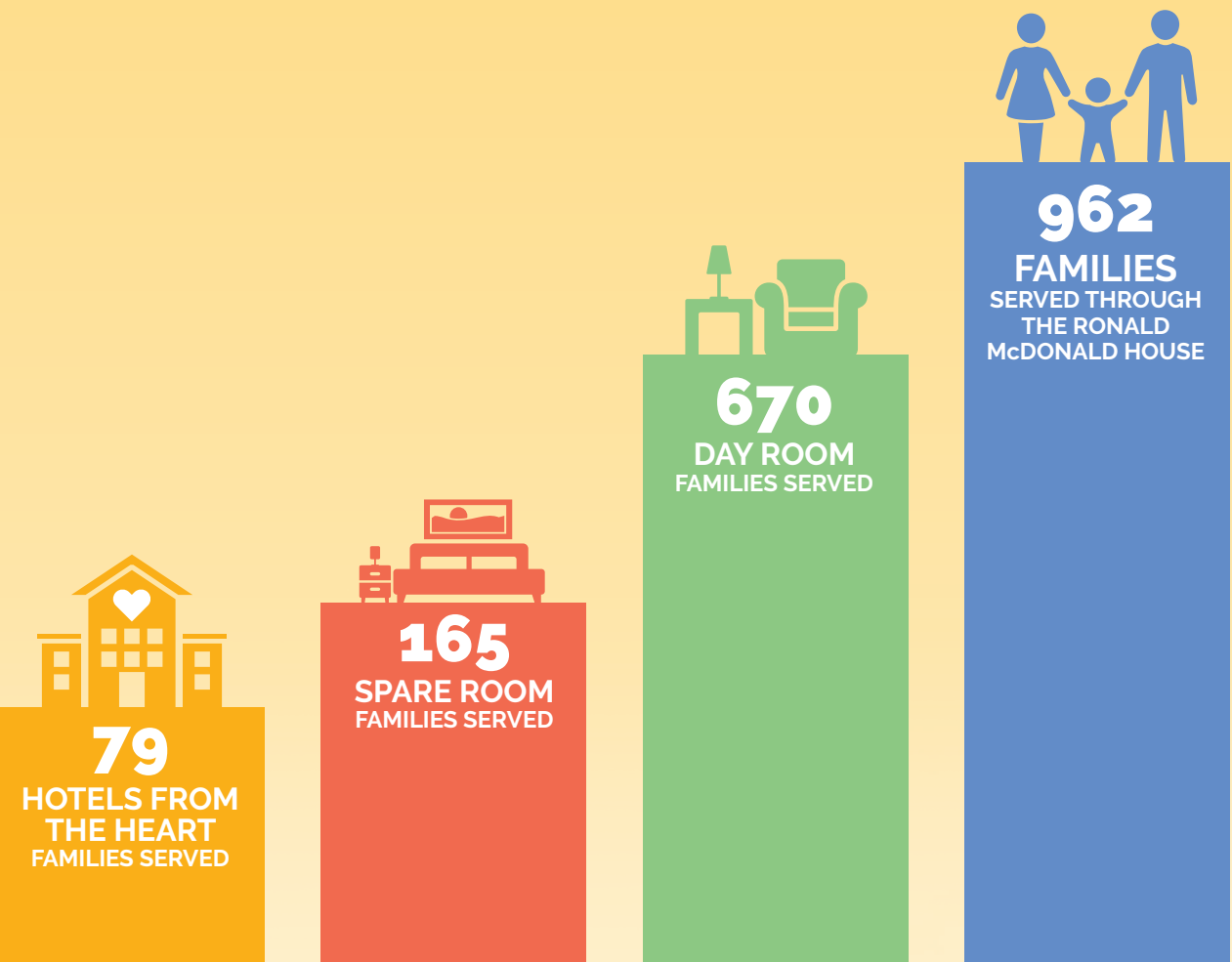
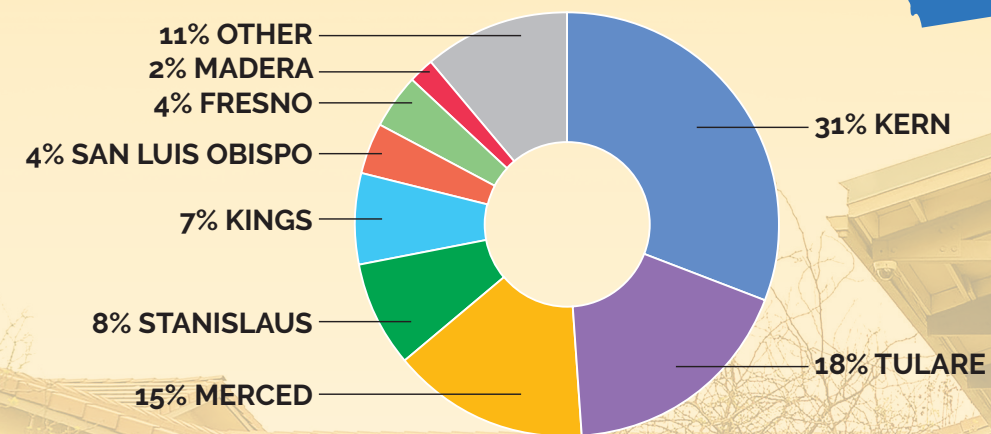
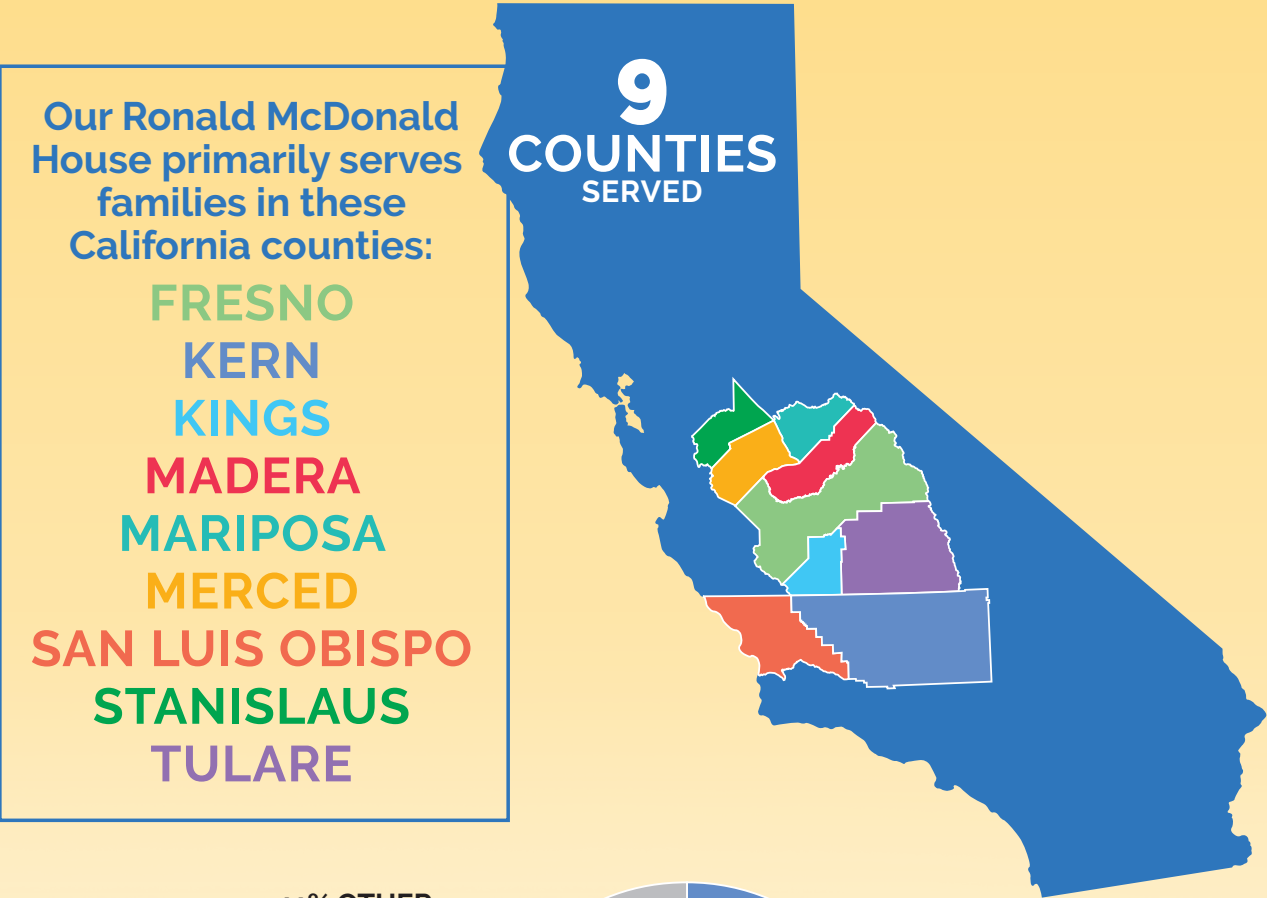

Jessica & Baby Ezra

Jessica was planning to spend just a couple of weeks in Porterville visiting her mom when she suddenly went into labor two and a half months early. Jessica delivered her very first baby, Ezra, at just 28 weeks old. Ezra weighed in at 2 pounds and 2 ounces and was transferred to the NICU immediately. Luckily, the Ronald McDonald House was able to accommodate Jessica while Ezra received treatment at Valley Children’s Hospital.

Having a room at the Ronald McDonald House allowed Jessica to spend quality time with Ezra, and allowed her to be just minutes away from him at all times.

“Being able to stay at the House helped me at a time when I had little left to give. It meant I could have a warm shower, eat at a table and have a nap in a bed. But more importantly, staying at the House allowed me to get to and from the NICU in minutes and spend as much time as possible with Ezra. I truly believe that being so close made all the difference.”

Jessica used all her time and energy to focus on getting her extremely premature baby healthy and strong enough to leave the hospital. Ezra began eating and breathing on his own and was released from Valley Children’s Hospital to go home in September, 2018.





# PROGRAMS

## KEEPING FAMILIES CLOSE FOR 34 YEARS

In 1984, the Central Valley Ronald McDonald House opened in Fresno to provide a "Home Away from Home" and resources to parents and families who had a child staying at a Central Valley medical facility. In 2001, we expanded to a 22,000 sq.ft. House adjacent to Valley Children's Hospital in Madera.

## THE RONALD McDONALD HOUSE

The Ronald McDonald House is the core program of the Ronald McDonald House Charities of the Central Valley. Our House is located in Madera, California and has 18 rooms to serve families in need. Additionally, our Day Room and Spare Room provide short-term accommodations for families.

Our House Guest Rooms are furnished with 2 queen beds, satellite TV, and a private bathroom. Guests share kitchens, laundry rooms, a living room, and a playroom. In 2018 we were able to serve 962 families with a "Home Away from Home" while their child was treated in the Hospital.



## DAY ROOM

The Day Room at the Ronald McDonald House is a space where families can take a mental and physical break from the stressful hospital environment. Families can use the space for up to eight hours per day to take care of their daily needs. In 2018, 670 families used the Day



Room to rest, eat, do laundry, take a shower, and just get a general break from the intense environment surrounding the care of their hospitalized child.



## SPARE ROOM

The Spare Room is the bedroom inside the Day Room where families can spend the night from 8pm to 8am. Many families who use this room typically have an early morning appointment at the hospital. This allows them to come in from out of town a day early, stay overnight, then head over to the hospital first thing in the morning. Other guests utilize the Spare Room until one of the regular Guest Rooms of the Ronald McDonald House becomes available. In 2018, we were able to accommodate an additional 165 families in this room.





# THE HAPPY WHEELS HOSPITALITY CART

The Happy Wheels Hospitality Cart was established in 2016 to bring comfort and care to families at Valley Children’s Hospital. The Happy Wheels Cart serves various snacks, beverages, hygiene items, and toys/activities for parents and children. The cart is staffed by Valley Children’s and RMHCCV volunteers and serves various units in the Hospital.



Completely free of charge, items distributed via the Happy Wheels Cart are donated by generous community members and various House partners, such as Lyons Magnus and Dr. Pepper.

The Happy Wheels program allows donors and volunteers to participate in providing hands-on support for children and families.

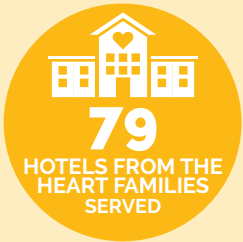

# HOTELS FROM THE HEART

With just 18 bedrooms, the Ronald McDonald House is at 100 percent capacity every night, often forcing us to turn away families we are unable to serve.

In an effort to minimize the number of families we turn away, we created the Hotels From the Heart program in 2016. We use a discount rate to place some families into rooms at our partner hotel, TownePlace Suites in Fresno.



Through the Hotels From the Heart program, we were able to serve an additional 79 families in 2018. Without this program, many families would have been forced to sleep in their cars or in cramped hospital rooms. Others may have had to stay home completely, missing valuable time with their sick or injured child.





# MEALS FROM THE HEART

The Meals From the Heart program invites volunteers to come to the House to cook and serve breakfast, lunch or dinner to our guest families. Just as salt, pepper, oil and vinegar are staples in your kitchens, the Waddell, Irmler and Goldsborough families are staples of our Meals From the Heart program.



Over a dozen are involved in this extended family. Even though most have full-time jobs, responsibilities at home, and families of their own to support, they take time one evening each month to make the Ronald McDonald House their priority. For the monthly meal, they prepare their famous “RMHCCV Chicken,” creamy mashed potatoes, and an impressive salad bar with all the fixings.

After preparing the delicious meal, the volunteer families make a point to stay and eat with the guest families. More often than not, the families staying at the Ronald McDonald House have spent their day talking to doctors and nurses about their sick child. These dedicated volunteer families know that lending an empathetic ear is paramount to someone with a child who is critically ill.

Mix together marinade ingredients and pour over chicken. Cover and place in fridge for 24 hours. Grill chicken until done. Enjoy!



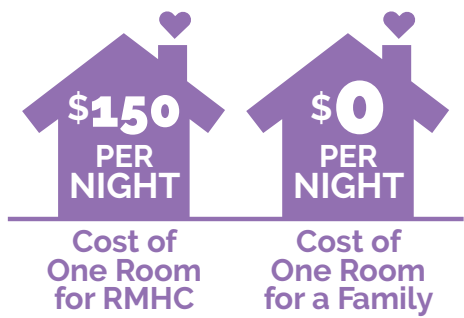

# FOUNDERS LEGACY

## THE FOUNDING DONORS OF RMHCCV
