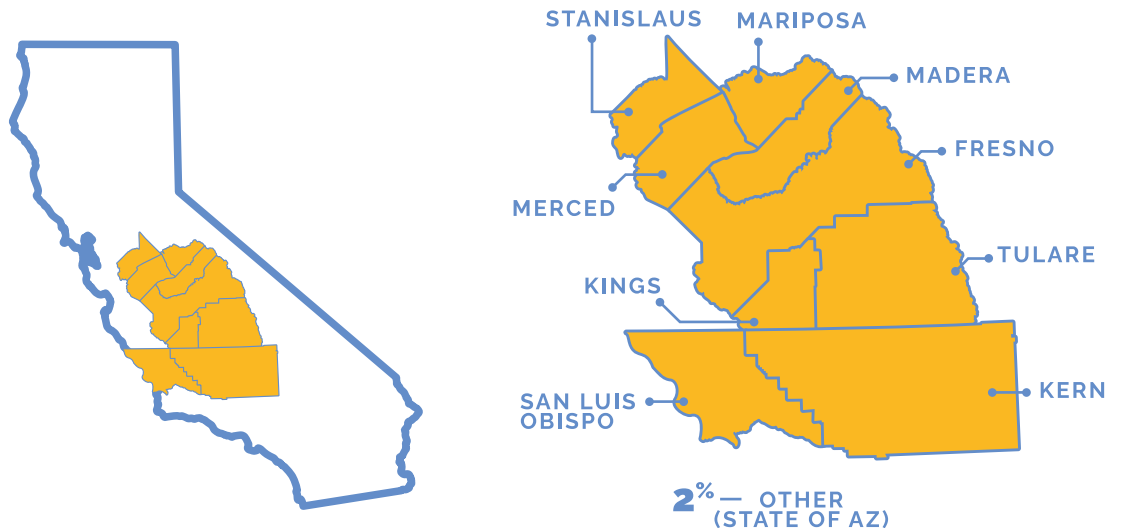

THE ORMONDE FAMILY

Our daughter, Julia, was diagnosed with congenital heart disease when she was just 9 months old. She underwent major heart surgery when she was only 10 days old. My husband and I spent every moment by her side while she recovered in the intensive care unit. I recall these times being so nerve-wracking, not knowing what would happen next.

During this time, my husband and I were unaware of Ronald McDonald House, so we slept in hospital chairs for several nights, just so we could be by Julia's side. I remember living off vending machine food or meals our family and friends could drop off to us.

We discovered the Ronald McDonald House when Julia needed an emergency surgery six years after her original stay. I remember the sense of relief and comfort when we found out we received a room at the House. Little did we know that we would soon become "regulars." This was just the beginning of Julia's diagnoses.



Without Ronald McDonald House, it's a lot harder, in so many different aspects; financially and emotionally. We were fortunate enough to stay in the "Day Room," at the House before a few of Julia's big surgeries. The Day Room allowed us to show up the night before major surgeries, without having to commute three hours in the morning before surgery. Being able to stay at the House lifted one of the biggest weights off our shoulders.

The Ronald McDonald House makes the most basic things feel like the biggest blessing when you're a parent just trying to hold it together for your child. Thank you Ronald McDonald House.

Today, Julia is 9 years old and will continue to have procedures and be monitored for the rest of her life.

COVID-19

Pandemic



The COVID-19 pandemic drastically affected our daily operations at RMHC Central Valley. While we are operating at a limited capacity due to ongoing restrictions, we remain steadfast in our mission to provide a "Home Away From Home" and resources for the families of children that are hospitalized at Valley Children's.

Families must pass strict COVID-19 testing and isolation protocols before registering to stay at the RMHC Central Valley, and cannot leave our campus once they have checked in. Families are asked to wear masks and perform daily temperature checks every time they enter the House. Because families were asked to stay on campus, we had groceries delivered on a weekly basis and often provided restaurant-prepared meals at no charge to the families. We look forward to continuing to serve our guest families as best we can during these unprecedented times, while maintaining the health and safety of our guests and staff.

PROGRAMS

DAY ROOM & SPARE ROOM

Our 1,000 square foot “overflow room” makes up The Day Room and Spare Room at RMHC Central Valley. Families that do not have an overnight stay room at RMHC Central Valley can secure a ‘Day Room Pass’ to use our facilities for up to 8 hours per day. Families with this pass can use our facilities, enjoy meals throughout the day, and rest while their child is hospitalized. In the evenings, this room converts into our “Spare Room,” so that families from our waiting list can stay with us overnight. We suspended these programs during COVID-19 to limit exposure during the pandemic, and utilized this time to completely renovate the space to better serve families when conditions permit.

MEALS FROM THE HEART

The popular Meals From the Heart program invites volunteers to the House to prepare, cook and serve breakfast, lunch or dinner to our guest families. With cheerful volunteers stopping by to cook meals, this program brings so much joy to our guest families.

Due to COVID-19, the Meals From the Heart program was suspended in 2020. We repurposed this program in 2021, asking our volunteers to consider giving a monetary gift so that we could purchase meals and groceries for our guest families, or drop off take-out meals for a special treat. While our trusted volunteers weren't physically cooking at RMHC Central Valley in 2021, their generous spirit was felt and much appreciated by our guest families. We thank our volunteers for continuing to support our guest families by providing funding for us to purchase meals during these unprecedented times.

HOTELS FROM THE HEART

Since RMHC Central Valley has only 18 bedrooms, our house is at 100% capacity every night, often forcing us to turn away more families than we are able to serve. In an effort to minimize the number of families we turn away, we created the Hotels From the Heart program in 2016. We apply for grants to secure funding that will allow us to use a discounted rate to place families into rooms at our partner hotels, the Hyatt Place and Marriott TownPlace Suites, in Fresno.

In 2021, the Hotels From the Heart program was even more valuable to our operations due to the COVID-19 pandemic. With increasing restrictions surrounding our guest families, we leaned on our hotel partners to be able to quickly help families. If a family just needed to stay near the hospital for only two or three nights for their child to have an outpatient procedure at Valley Children's, we used our hotel resources to place them in our partner hotels, leaving rooms at RMHC Central Valley available for families who needed to stay with us long-term.

We would like to thank The Fansler Foundation for investing in the mission of RMHC Central Valley by generously donating to this program.

Through the Hotels From the Heart program, we were able to serve 89 families in 2021; which provided 200 nights for short-term stays.

Through our new meals program, we were able to serve 5,734 families meals in 2021.

DAY ROOM & SPARE ROOM RENOVATION

In 2021, RMHC Central Valley received a \$10,000 grant from the Frank & Evelyn Schmidt Family Foundation to renovate the Day Room and Spare Room. With this generous funding, RMHC Central Valley hired Tangram Interiors to professionally redesign the rooms—complete with new paint, furniture and layout to better accommodate families.

Ashley Webster-Rudolph, RMHC Central Valley Ambassador and Associate Publisher of The Business Journal, encouraged RMHC Central Valley to apply for the grant funding from her family's foundation after she toured the House and saw that many upgrades were needed.

"The Day Room and Spare Room at RMHC Central Valley are incredible resources for the families of children who are hospitalized, and while touring the House in 2019 with the RMHC Central Valley Ambassador group, I noticed that major upgrades were necessary to add to the comfort and functionality of the space. The Frank & Evelyn Schmidt Family Foundation is proud to 'adopt' this space to help families during their time of need."

DOLLARS FOR DINNER

Since 2017, we've raised critical funds to purchase meals for our guest families through the Dollars For Dinner campaign. The popular Meals From the Heart program was suspended in March of 2020 due to COVID-19, eliminating the support of volunteers who cooked meals for our guest families. Due to this drastic overnight change, we were left to purchase meals and groceries for our guest families.

This change in our operations resulted in us increasing our crowdfunding goal to \$52,000 in just one month. While this was an ambitious fundraising goal, the reinstatement of the Meals From the Heart program remained unknown due to the pandemic, and we needed to ensure that there was enough funding to purchase at least one meal per day for our guest families for the entire year.

The campaign kicked off in August with the support of our board of directors, staff, and RMHC Central Valley Ambassadors. We hosted various activities throughout the month, utilized social media in new and unique ways, and raised awareness and critical funding for our guest families. We thank our donors and matching sponsors who gave so generously to this campaign, ensuring that our guest families have meals to eat while their child is hospitalized far from home.



MEAL PROGRAM

It is our goal to provide all the comforts of home for our guest families staying at RMHC Central Valley. We know that after the end of a long day at the hospital, food may be the last thing on a family's mind. To help our guest families feel as comfortable as possible while staying with us, we created a robust meal and grocery plan to provide food for our guest families every single day.

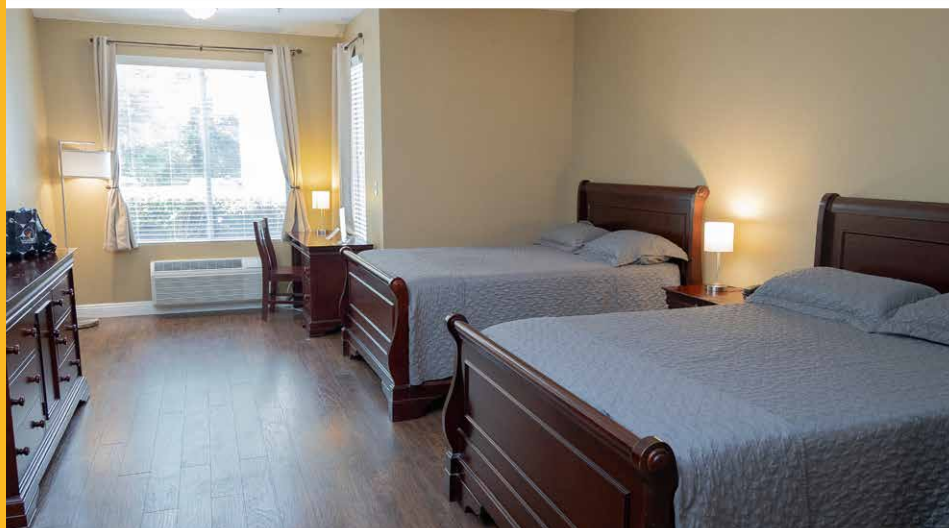
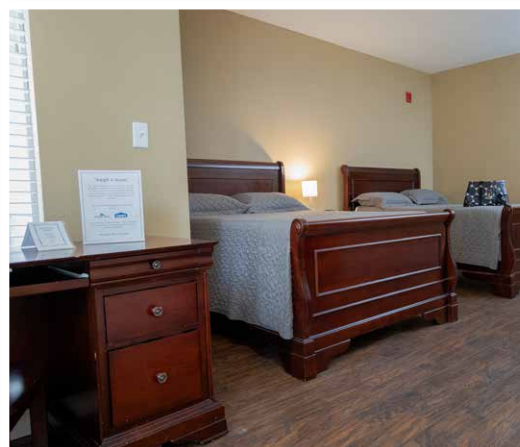
ADOPT-A-ROOM

We offer 18 hotel-like guest suites for families that need a place to stay while their child is receiving medical care at the Valley Children's Hospital. Each room features two queen beds, satellite TV, WiFi and a private bathroom with access to shared spaces like kitchens, laundry rooms, living rooms, a playroom, outdoor play areas and patios. We are grateful to our Adopt-A-Room partners for their generous investment in our House. With their donations, we can replace furniture, paint, make routine maintenance updates and more. It is because of these donors' investment in our mission that we can provide a "Home Away From Home" and resources for families of children that are hospitalized.

In 2021, we adjusted our Adopt-A-Room reporting metrics, as guest families are regularly rotated in and out of suites, to allow for regular room sanitization. Families are socially distanced in all wings of the House and common living areas are available to one family at a time.

THE VIDAURI FAMILY

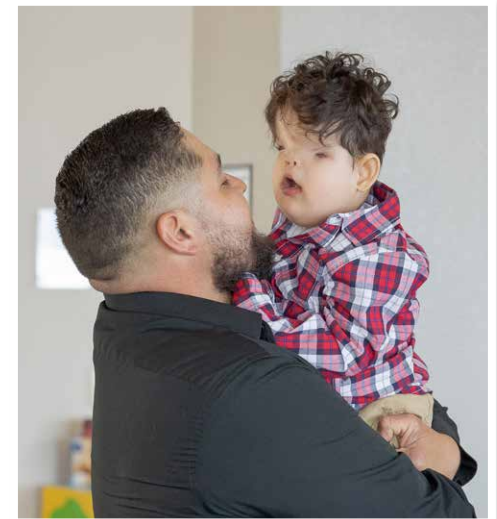
Our baby, Angel, was born prematurely with an extremely rare condition, called Frontal Encephalocele. From our first ultrasound, we were told that our son would be born with multiple issues that would affect his skull and face. Only one in every 35-million pregnancies have these specific conditions. The doctors didn't know if he would make it past birth, or if the surgeries would help. When Angel was born, his airway collapsed during birth and he was quickly taken to the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit at Valley Children's Hospital where he was intubated.

We knew that we needed to be close to him, but we were over 30 miles away from the hospital. We were placed on the waiting list at Ronald McDonald House. As soon as we got the call that a room was available, we were so relieved. We knew that we would literally be walking distance from the hospital.

"Being at the Ronald McDonald House allowed us to be able to go back and forth to the hospital as much as we could. If there was an important question or decisions that needed to be made we could be there in minutes." —Angel's Dad

It was so nice to be able to settle down after a long day spent at the hospital, come back to the House to enjoy a meal and relax. We made friends with some of the other parents who were staying at the House at the same time as us. We never had to worry about food or supplies. Ronald McDonald House provided everything that we needed while we were away from home.

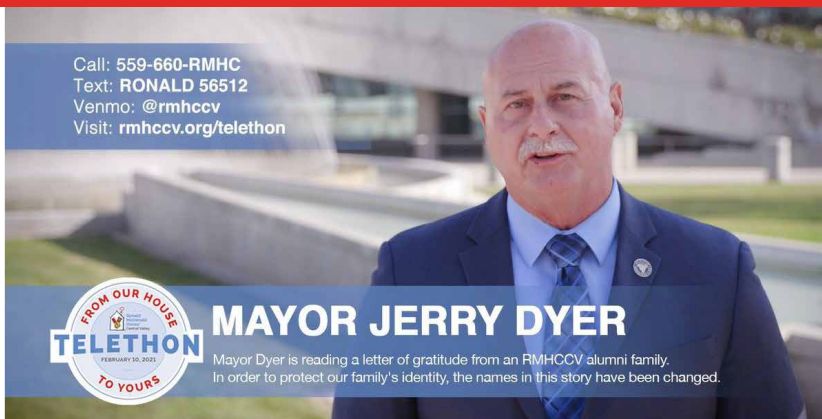
