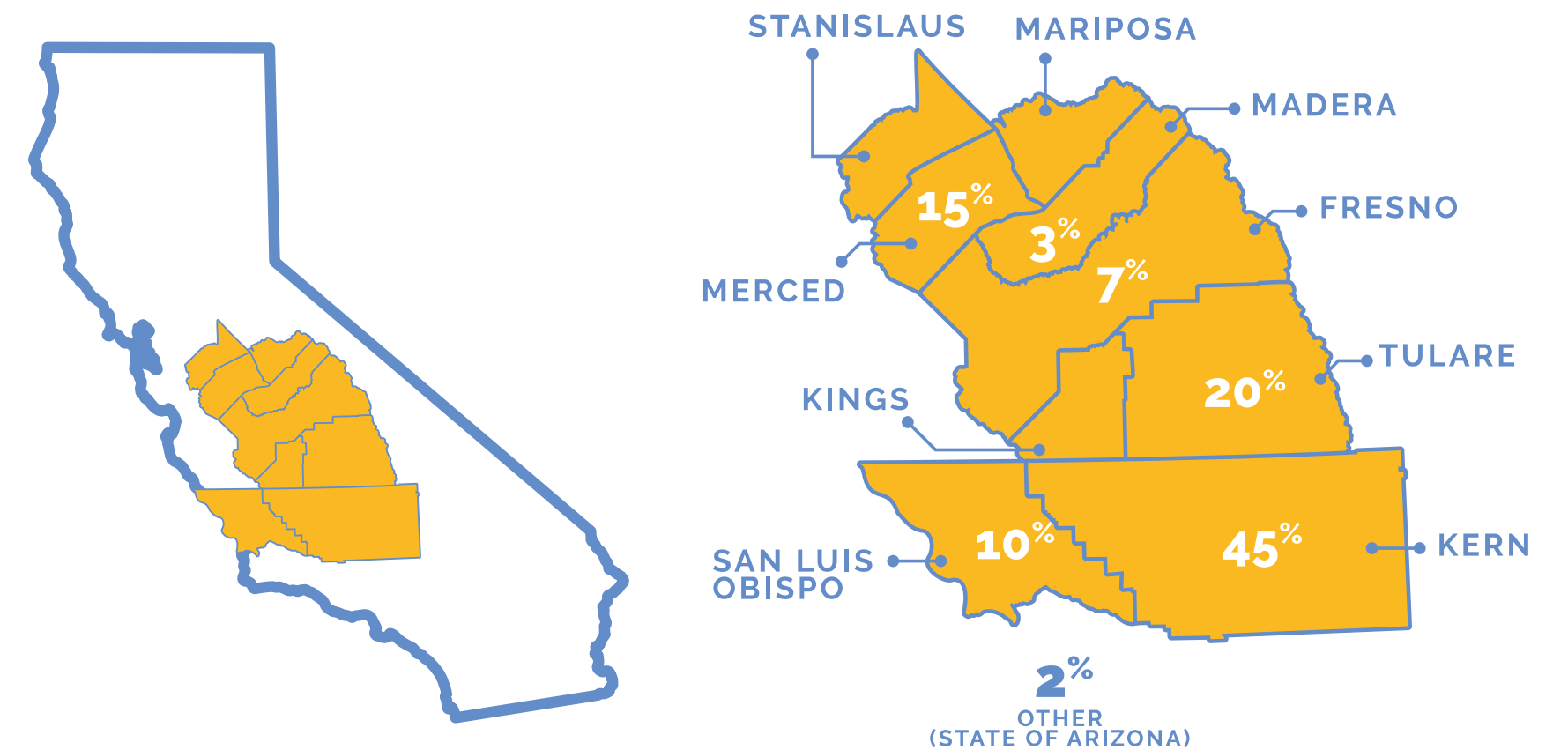

Last year represented a new beginning for RMHC Central Valley as pandemic conditions turned more favorable, we turned our attention to returning to some degree of normalcy and improving the Ronald McDonald House guest experience. We continue to embrace many pandemic best practices as new common area wipeable furniture was purchased, all 18 guest rooms were painted, and rooms were upgraded with 50" televisions.

During the pandemic, the Ronald McDonald House remained open and we were grateful to continue to serve the caregivers of hospitalized patients of our valued partner Valley Children’s Hospital. The Ronald McDonald House serves 9 counties and our caregivers come from great distances during a critical time of need in their lives. PROGRAMS

KEEPING FAMILIES CLOSE FOR 38 YEARS

In 1984, the Central Valley Ronald McDonald House opened in Fresno to provide a "Home Away from Home" and resources to parents and families who had a child staying at a Central Valley medical facility. In 2001, we expanded to a 22,000 square foot House adjacent to Valley Children's Hospital in Madera.

THE RONALD MCDONALD HOUSE

The Ronald McDonald House is the core program of the Ronald McDonald House Charities of the Central Valley. Our House is located in Madera, California and has 18 rooms to serve families of hospitalized children.

DAY ROOM AND SPARE ROOM

Our 1,000 square foot "overflow room" makes up the Day Room and Spare Room at RMHC Central Valley. Families that do not have an overnight stay room at RMHC Central Valley can secure a 'Day Room Pass' to use our accommodations, enjoy meals throughout the day, and rest while their child is hospitalized. In the evenings, this room converts into our "Spare Room," so that families on our waiting list can stay with us overnight.



HOTELS FROM THE HEART

The Hotels From The Heart program was created in 2016 so that RMHC Central Valley could place families into rooms at our partner hotels at a discounted rate until a room becomes available at RMHC Central Valley. Our partners at the Hyatt Place and Sonesta Suites in Fresno accommodate families as needed.

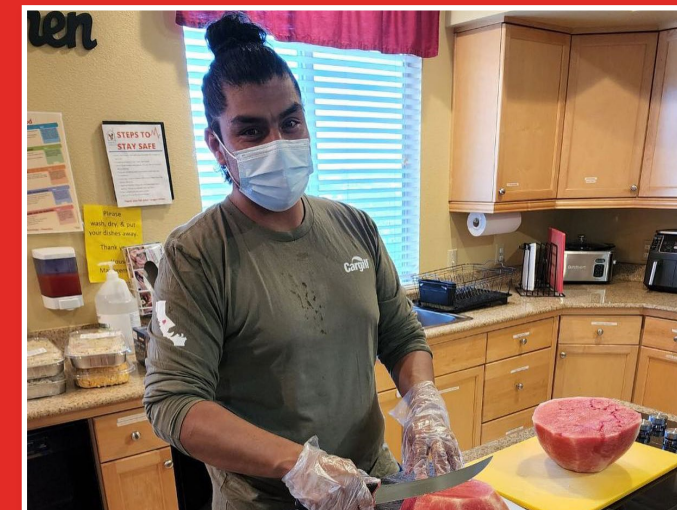
MEALS FROM THE HEART

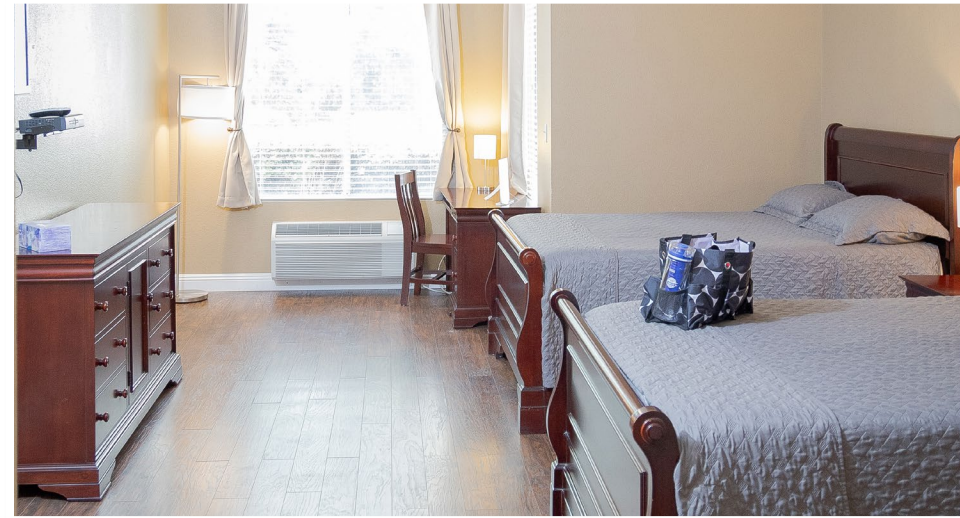


ADOPT-A-ROOM

Each room features two queen beds, satellite TV, WiFi and a private bathroom with access to shared spaces like kitchens, laundry rooms, living rooms, a playroom, outdoor play areas and patios. It is because of these Adopt-A-Room donors' investment in our mission that we can provide a 'home away from home' and resources for families of children that are hospitalized.
